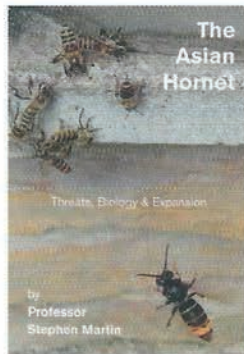

By D Basterfield, R Cullum-Kenyon & I Davis

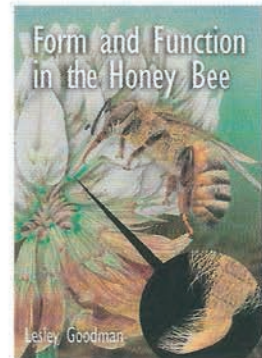

Form and Function of the Honey Bee

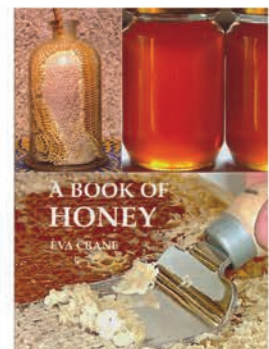
by Lesley Goodman
